Garinger's New Principal
Mike Drye has moved to Hawk Ridge Elementary as Principal.

As of July 1, Garinger's new Principal is Dr. Kelly Gwaltney.



Kelly was previously the chief school performance officer for CMS. As part of the Beacon Initiative, Kelly will spend a week at the University of Virginia in July to begin coming up with two-year goals for Garinger based on student achievement and school culture.

The program will also help to determine what data to use to track progress and to develop a 90-day plan to begin accomplishing these goals.

Kelly has an extensive history as a teacher and a principal. She served as principal at Mallard Creek High before moving into administrative roles and was the Gaston County Schools principal of the year in 2006. She has also served as a zone superintendent and chief human resources officer for CMS.

Teacher Initiatives

The Foundation has raised \$2,500 in restricted funds to help with teacher appreciation events and initiatives including a breakfast, luncheon and several other items to recognize teachers. The Foundation had 18 pavers engraved for the walkway to the Vietnam Memorial to recognize teachers and staff members with over ten years of service.

Scholarships

On May 18, at the Garinger Honors and Awards Program, the Foundation awarded 15 \$2,500 scholarships to members of the Class of 2015. Each recipient was presented with a KIA bracelet with the name of the fallen classmate the scholarship honored engraved along with the name of the recipient. 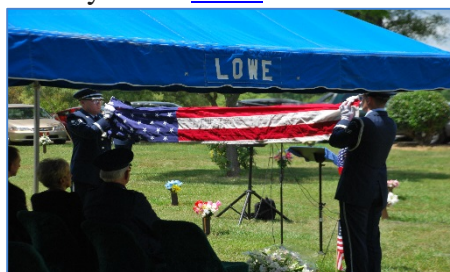
Of the 15 recipients from 2014 we have 12 that will be applying for a \$2,500 scholarship for their sophomore year. Their GPA's averaged 3.34 and two were 4.0. We believe the mentoring program led by Jane Suitt (Class of 1964) was very helpful to these recipients. We are proud of the scholastic achievements of these 2014 recipients.

Scholarship Funds

The Foundation has fully funded this year's scholarships. There is approximately \$15,000 in unrestricted funds currently on hand towards the scholarship needs for 2016.

Vietnam Memorial Pathway and Plantings and KIA activities

The Foundation has constructed a pathway from the school's front entrance to the memorial with a circular pathway around the memorial with decorative plantings. A bench wall sufficient to hold a class at the memorial is included. The Foundation has engraved a number of pavers on the pathway to recognize the school's long history and also pavers for the 19 principals that have served the school since 1909. Graduation Pledge Campaign

The Foundation has raised \$5,500 in restricted funds in order to fund a student pledge campaign. Each student participant will sign an unconditional pledge agreeing to finish high school no matter how hard the obstacles. Each participating student will receive a pledge bracelet and be eligible for several awards for participating. This campaign is scheduled to begin in September 2015.

Building 200 and 300 Gardens

The Foundation has raised \$1,500 in restricted funds towards improving the interior gardens and other planting areas. Plans are being made to add student seating in the interior gardens to provide teaching opportunities for classes in the gardens.

Baseball Field and Facilities

Several individuals from The Foundation have helped upgrade the baseball facilities and equipment this year. Additionally, funds were raised to help support some team social activities.
